OCM Supported Missionary Couple: ZEG

Thank you for your tireless work in supporting the work of the Lord back home and abroad and for continuing to stoke the flames of missions in OCM.

The beginning of 2023 brought much refreshment along with challenges. It was our very first home assignment, which deeply refreshed our spirits to reconnect with friends and family. It was especially encouraging to return to the community of OCM. At the same time, it was also a very jam-packed home assignment. We cleared out our home to prepare it for sale, preached an inaugural Chinese sermon in both Mandarin and Cantonese, tested for professional licenses in teaching English, and (our son) underwent his third cleft palate surgery.

As we return to Asia, we're looking forward to jumping back into the work and into the natural rhythms of life here. We will continue to progress in our proficiency in the local language, develop training materials alongside our team leader, disciple locals who have a heart for Muslim ministries, and further local Muslim friendships through frontline restaurant visitations. For this new season, we are aiming to expand our frontline outreach to public squares, parks, prayer rooms, and personal contacts. With Covid policies lifted, more can be done.

- 3) Please especially lift up our son's post-operative recovery. The bone graft is not taking well and the incision remains open.



Who we are: H.O.P.E. Bible Mission serves in Guatemala, Central America. The national team seeks to foster programs that focus entirely on underserved communities which have limited access to Biblical training, education, and healthcare. Working in partnership with AGAPE, a small plane aviation ministry based in Guatemala City, H.O.P.E. helps give physical access and spiritual edification to pastors, churches, and teachers in the Quiché mountain region of Guatemala. H.O.P.E. focuses on Biblical Leadership Training, youth training, and a Firm Foundations program for teachers of children. Run:Hope, our education initiative, provides training for teachers and support for students to access a middle school education.

Our work this year: Our year began with a four-day conference for 25 of our Run: Hope teachers and three school directors to prepare for a new school year and to be encouraged and edified spiritually. The Biblical leadership program is in full swing this year teaching 67 pastors and leaders with a systematic three-year program. Our Firm Foundations program for teachers began this past spring in Salquil Grande and we are thrilled that it is being taught by our first seminary graduate that was supported through our Run: Hope program.

Future plans: Our vision is to continue to remain faithful amidst continued difficulty in travel due to strong rainy seasons and difficult mountain roads. We are exploring the possibility to begin a Light and Life school in the community of Chel. The need for Bible training in new communities exceeds our current staffing, but we are so grateful for a wonderfully devoted team who does whatever is needed to keep paths open for ministry.

Pray for us:

- 1. Pray for spiritual and physical health and strength for each member of our national team (7 couples and 5 individuals) as well as three pilots currently in training with our partner ministry AGAPPE.
- 2. Pray for all those who participate in our ministry programs, for perseverance, for wisdom and discernment as they in turn lead their churches, students, and communities.
- 3. Pray for Deb Carey as she develops and directs the Run:Hope program and prepares the conference for January 2024 and for Rick as he balances his roles within OCM and HOPE.



We (the "Abu Khalil" Family) are with Pioneers International. Pioneers mobilizes teams to glorify God among unreached peoples by initiating church-planting movements in partnership with local churches. We work in the Middle East, and our ministry is focused on reaching Arabic speaking Muslims in North Africa and the Middle East with the gospel, disciple making movements and training National believers in Christ from both Christian and Muslim backgrounds to fulfil the Great Commission. "Rafik" is both the head of Maarifa, (a project of our Media Department) and the area leader for two countries in our North Africa Middle East Region, and "Cindy" works in Media as a graphic designer.

- 64 Arab missionaries went to the field to reach out the unreached people groups in UAE, Egypt, Sudan, India
- 91 House fellowships in Egypt, Sudan and Morocco
- New believers from Muslim Background through our media ministry is: 270 people in the last 7 months in 2023

Our mission at Women of Wonder! (WOW!) is to build a community that walks alongside women to uncover and affirm their God-given calling through prayer, teaching, and celebration in hopes

of fulfilling our vision to see sisters soar. Our ministries reflect our values of DISCOVERY (we are committed to the ongoing journey of discovering who God is and who we are), HOSPITALITY (we embody God's heart of hospitality through unhurried welcome, acceptance, and engagement) and PRESENCE (we invite you into generous and compassionate attentiveness to others, to self, and to God. Our presence to one another seeks to lovingly honor every story as part of God's story). We carry out the vision, mission, and values in partnership with churches and organizations in caring for and sustaining their leaders through our monthly Biblical teaching seminars, silent retreats, prayer support, and spiritual care ministries. WOW! believes this will help the Church to flourish to the fullness of its calling in affirming God's call to leadership and discipleship for every individual with the hopes of men and women being able to lead alongside one another to further God's kingdom here on earth.

We started 2023 with strong emphasis on spiritual formation work. There was an increase in collaborative partnerships as ministry groups and churches opened up their spaces and their community for WOW! to serve their leadership. In person, we have led workshops about deeper reflective prayer with SOON Movement, hosted day retreats in both NYC and Boston and held our semi-annual weekend silent retreat. We continued to journey alongside individuals and groups through spiritual direction and discernment of their calling and purpose virtually through two Lent cohorts that included women in locations all the way from the northeast US to Hawaii, a three month winter Soul Care Cohort for women in leadership and an eight month series of group journeying for a small group of women that spanned from fall 2022 to summer 2023. We sponsored a three day NYC women's conference with Full Collective that had an audience of 200 attendees, with women coming from all over the US and overseas with the emphasis of women being sowers of God's word and work. For the 1-on-1 spiritual care directed by each of the WOW! Staff, we have had an increased participation as a result of receiving a grant from Thriving in Ministry to reach a wider audience. We will close off the summer with one more Refresh Silent Retreat.

For the remainder of 2023, we will be facilitating several more cohorts, virtual half day silent retreat and an active contemplative day retreat in the NYC. We are participating in a year long cohort with a group of women leaders exploring how to build and develop compassionate leadership and communities through more reflective and contemplative practices. This is fairly new in many church spaces, but we are seeing that creating more spaces to listen to one another as Jesus took the time to listen can be powerfully transformative for individuals and groups. We will finish the year with some additional fundraising and board recruitment work.

WOW! We are continuing to build our organizational capacity and hope to add someone to our team to reach and serve a wider audience. We are praying for more individual and church partnerships to strengthen our ongoing work of relational support to missionaries, seminary students, nonprofit leaders and ordained and lay leaders in the Church.

- Manni Lee: Family care and support has been more demanding and would like more strength and God's provision to help meet needs. More flexibility in engaging with young adult children so as to continue to walk alongside them with faith, hope and love.
- Erika Lee: We are praying for more alignment between my ministry with WOW! and Jeff's pastoral ministry within the church we serve.
- May Lee: Praying for a deeper relationship with my daughter and her relationship with God restored and faith renewed.



Chinese Overseas Christian Mission

Reaching the Chinese to reach Europe. Evangelizing and discipling foreign students, immigrants, 2nd generation, and nurturing believers in the UK and Europe through partnership with churches and parachurch

organizations. Equipping them to plant and develop churches/fellowships and to serve their communities. Encouraging disciples to share the gospel both intra-culturally and cross-culturally throughout the UK, Europe and beyond in their home countries.



Candy Zhang

As a COCM missionary, my primary focus is serving Mandarin-speaking students and immigrants in the UK and Europe, while coordinating ministries at the COCM Training Centre. By the end of this June, I have transitioned from supporting a church in north London after nine years, and I am deeply grateful for the opportunity to serve there, especially in helping with the restart of their Mandarin service after Covid. Meanwhile, the COCM Training Center has come to

its first-year milestone and praise the Lord for the progress made, particularly for the transformation of two courses into resources that could be used for lay leaders to use in their local settings.

Looking ahead to the fall and the upcoming year, my ministry plans will focus on three key areas. Firstly, we aim to further develop the Training Center by offering relevant courses and resources that will empower churches, address their needs, and raise up more leaders. Secondly, I will be supervising and mentoring university graduate volunteers who stay at the mission center. Lastly, in response to the significant influx of Chinese students in London, we have decided to launch Oasis London, an outreach initiative creatively sharing the gospel with the young generation.

Xu & Melody with Caleb, Olivia & Clayton are doing Mandarin-speaking student ministry with COCM in the UK. Our priority is leading two campus fellowships

covering three universities. Two universities in the midland city of the UK called Leicester, and another one is Cranfield University, which is 20 minutes driving from COCM

Headquarter. The work includes guiding the Mandarin-speaking University students to seek for God, to know God and to longing for God. This is achieved by various approaches such as Bible study, personal evangelism, pastoral caring, discipleship training and so forth. We also support other Mandarin ministry in COCM such as camp ministry, gospel team, and preaching in Chinese Churches.

In recent years, with the arrival of our three children one after another, we have shifted our focus from leading and supporting nationwide ministries to engaging in local church support ministries. This year, COCM has sent us to serve at the Milton Keynes Chinese Christian Church in the UK, particularly in their Mandarin-speaking congregation. Over the past few months, in addition to leading the church in establishing a Mandarin-speaking student ministry at a nearby university, we have also been actively involved in preaching, leading Bible studies, sharing the Gospel, providing pastoral care to members, and offering support in various ways to the Mandarin-speaking congregation of the church.

Firstly, we will continue to lead the church in conducting student evangelism ministry at nearby universities, spreading the Gospel to Mandarin-speaking students. Secondly, we will persist in shepherding the Mandarin-speaking congregation within the church. Especially with the influx of a significant number of new immigrants from Hong Kong joining the church, we will place a stronger emphasis on fostering communication and unity between Mandarin and Cantonese-speaking congregations within the church. Lastly, we also hope to engage in more learning and experimentation within the children ministry. Resources for children's Sunday school in the UK's Chinese churches are relatively scarce, and we aspire to introduce more resources, train Sunday school teachers, and guide children to grow healthily in the Lord.

- 1. Please pray for our pastoral ministry at Milton Keynes Chinese Christian Church. May our service bring glory to God, benefit others, and contribute to the building of God's house and Christ's church. Also, pray that we can encourage more church brothers and sisters to get involved in student evangelism ministry.

Tim, Rosie, Adora & Serena Li

are based in Milton Keynes, serving at COCM mission center. Our ministries include three

major parts: student ministry, church supporting and new media. Tim and Rosie lead a campus student fellowship in central London and support the Chinese Church in London New Soho Congregation (leading worship, leading Bible study and preaching). Tim also coordinates 'Living Water' new media ministry, including an online Christian magazine (COCM活水文字- Living Water Ministry (livingwatercocm.org)) and a podcast (渔舟畅聊). Besides helping centralized conferences, Tim coordinates COCM Mandarin Student Ministry Forum and makes videos for COCM general director's monthly sharing.

Light and Life fellowship in London: Give thanks to God that He has blessed us a student core team. We have been witnessing God's work as the number of regular attendees increased from 5 to 30+, which encouraged us a lot. Church Support: Tim and Rosie has served in a Chinese church situated in central London for 6 years. The majority of the church members are university students and young professionals/families. As the advisor of their mandarin core team, Tim helped restructure their serving team and develop a series of workshops on sex, which has very good feedback. Rosie focuses on young family ministry and serves at the mums' group.

After 7 years based at COCM mission centre serving fellowships and churches in London, God has led Tim and Rosie into a new ministry direction. Tim, Rosie and two daughters will be sent by COCM to Glasgow, the largest city in Scotland, to plant a mandarin-speaking church next summer. Currently, there is almost no mandarin Sunday service in Glasgow but there are more than 10,000 students and a large number of Chinese families there. Before moving into this new direction, Tim and Rosie is now in 6-month sabbatical after working with COCM for 7 years. Rosie continues her theological studies and Tim prepares for church planting.

Mak and Narola Sanglir: Thailand

Our ministry is holistic, focusing on the Hmong people in Nan Province, North Thailand whose religious background is animist and spirit worship. We are involved in evangelism, church planting, discipleship making, leadership training, member care, and children and youth ministry. The Lord led us to start The Firm Foundation (TFF), which focuses on reaching out to children from Grade 1 to university students. Currently, Kathy's Home

(KH) in Pua, House of Hope (HOH) in Thawangpha and Beacon Hall (BH) in Chiangmai are registered under this foundation. We minister at KH, Monday through Friday and go to the Hmong villages on Sat- Sun for weekend ministry.

Our weekly ministry is teaching the Bible (Mon - Fri) to the children at Kathy's Home and going for weekend ministry to the Hmong villages. We teach in the churches and mentor the families in their homes during home visits and some after Sunday worship at the church. In January, we visited our former coworker's family whose dad passed away in another province. Early March, we had VBS at KH before the end of the school year. We also visited Mak's mom, 94-years-old, during the school break in April and rejoiced together with our second son Jason as he proposed to his fiancé Imtila, in Nagaland. The new school year started in May with 29 students from seven villages. We were blessed with two visits from team Singapore and the recent team from OCM. The team members have encouraged us and all the children at KH through their testimonies and sharing from God's word. The highlight was also a reunion with our alumni in Bangkok and in the North. Praise God for those who are no longer babes in Christ!

We look forward to the upcoming English camp mid-September and late November, and the VBS/English camp early next year at KH. We want to focus on families as well and have Bible studies in the villages. Additionally, we will be speaking in Nepal in Oct to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the church that the Lord helped Mak start at our house in Kathmandu. We will also speak at a couples retreat back to back in Nepal. Lord willing, we plan to be back in Nagaland for Christmas to plan for Jay's wedding early Jan. We are praying we can complete the Chronological method of Bible study (Creation to Christ) with the children at KH before school ends in Feb/March.

Gospel Station:

OCM Reaching Out to Our Community by Kim Ng

How did it start? When Minister Chan was invited to serve in our church on July, 2021 to train and mobilize us for evangelism, she and I started as small as a team of two to reach out to the people in the park, subway stations, and street vendors. After two months, we started setting up Gospel Station right outside our church on the sidewalk, sharing the gospel and showing care by giving out hand sanitizers and masks.

Fellowships Serving: We are thankful that starting in January 2022, our Fellowship Department invited all the Chinese fellowships to join Gospel Station on a quarterly basis. So far 13 fellowships have been participating and sometimes with their specialties or talents, they have brought fun and joy to the community besides sharing about our church and the gospel.

Short Term Encounters, Long Term Follow Ups

Every new friend we meet on the street, as long as we have contact information, we have a caring person from one of our 2 faithful teams doing follow up by various means such as:

- Phone calls,
- Sunday services or fellowships,
- OCM Senior Center,
- Special gospel events just for these newcomers, such as Easter Gathering on 4/16/23 and had a total of more than 30 newcomers,
- Small groups of gospel talks or evangelistic Bible studies **Gospel Station Today:** We continue to give out about 300 gospel newspapers or tracts weekly. Thanks to Minister Chan's Sunday evangelism class, the trainees were encouraged to share the gospel for the first time almost weekly this past summer.

OCM Street Fair





OCM Street Fair is a yearly outreach ministry which OCM has done for over a decade. 2023 is the 1st time we were able to have the OCM Street Fair again since Covid started. On July 29, 2023, OCM was able to hold a 1-day Block Party on Hester Street between Mott Street and Elizabeth Street from 9am – 4pm with over 10 booths on the street. We had over 250+ volunteers on that day who met at 9:15am for orientation along with a set up team outside on Hester Street helping to set up tents and tables. We were thankful for God to hold back the rain as the forecast stated it would rain most of the day.

There were 7 Fellowships Booths from Song of Songs, GraceSprings, Galilee, Blessings, Hosanna, Cornerstone, Glad Tidings, along with Grace Fellowship helping with the Welcome booth, Children's Arts & Craft booth and Local Missions helping to run the Evangelism booth. Canaan fellowship helped to feed everyone lunch on the 3rd floor.

Throughout the day, hundreds of people in the Chinatown community would walk by and participate in the fellowship game booths to get small prizes for their kids or talk with OCM members about Jesus. There were many stories we have heard where people within the community were open to conversations about Jesus and some even asked for prayer.

Continue to pray for the seeds that were planted on that day with those we interacted with as OCM continues to make an impact in Chinatown through the OCM Street Fair, Gospel Station and other outreach ministries.

Youth STM to Harrisburg, PA





OCM Youth Short Term Missions trips have a history of many years partnering with YouthWorks which is a missions organization that helps to organize Youth STM trips throughout the United States. In 2022 and 2023, OCM sent a Youth STM to Harrisburg Pennsylvania which is a city that is underprivileged and is a food desert for many. This year Pastor Austin Woo led the Youth STM with a couple of Father/Sons: Aaron and Derek Young and Stephen and Jeffrey Huang. When the team arrived in Harrisburg PA we settled into a local church where we would stay for the week with 6-7 other partner churches with over 60+ other youth and adult leaders from New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Rhode Island joining together to serve the community of Harrisburg, PA.

The YouthWorks staff provided a space for all the youth to get to know one another through group games, worship time and time to reflect on God and share about what they learned from serving during that week. The YouthWorks staff also led our time of morning devotions and challenged the youth with the 2023 Theme was "You Are Here." You are here to love the Lord your God and to love your neighbor. You are here to share what you have and who you are. And you are here to unite together as we discover how to live like Jesus.

YouthWorks helped to set up Service projects throughout the Harrisburg community for all of the youth and adults to partner with and serve there for throughout the week. We were given options to serve at a couple of local Foodbanks, a community garden, Harrisburg Christian Performing Arts Center, Ronald Mcdonald House, the Boys & Girls Club of Harrisburg, a Senior Center, a horse farm, and a couple of local churches. The youth engaged in community service projects like painting, cleaning, yardwork, along with packing food and food distribution to the community. The OCM team partnered with another church to serve at the Ronald Mcdonald House cleaning their outdoor area and doing yardwork in a local church. In addition, we spent an entire day at the Boys & Girls club of Harrisburg interacting with underprivileged kids for their "Sports Day."

- 1) Pray for the city of Harrisburg and those who are underprivileged and disadvantaged.
- 2) Pray for the youth that attended the STM trip that they will mature in their faith as they continue to take steps to grow like serving in the STM trip.

Higher Heights Basketball Outreach





Higher Heights (HH) is a Basketball ministry to outreach to JHS students which was started over 20 years ago by OCM members. HH uses the platform of basketball as a way to connect with the youth and to serve the Chinatown community with the intention of sharing the Gospel. HH combines basketball training, Bible study and Small

Groups along with worship to build connections with our campers and volunteers to share Jesus with them. Every Summer, the HH Basketball ministry meets on 5-6 Saturdays during the Summer. During the mornings the campers and volunteers are at a local gym learning how to play basketball and playing games. Then at lunch time, everyone heads back to OCM for lunch, worship and Bible study. At the end of the camp, we had a closing ceremony with awards and lunch. During the closing ceremony, we shared the Gospel message to all the campers and volunteers.

Higher Heights prior to Covid had over 90+ JHS kids each year along with over 30-40 volunteers. Over the past 2 years, we had over 20-40 JHS kids with over 25 volunteers. Most of volunteers are high school students and/or former campers along with dedicated OCM members serving as coaches, assistant coaches and referees.

- 1) Pray that the coaches can continue to minister to both our campers and volunteers who don't yet know the love of Christ. We had 7 HH campers join Summer Conference.
- 2) Pray for the campers and volunteers to be connected with the youth group.
- 3) Pray for more adult OCM members to serve for next years outreach.

OCM Backpack Giveaway



During August 2023, OCM launched a new local missions initiative and partnered directly with local elementary schools to provide elementary school students (with particular focus on under-served populations) with new backpacks and school supplies ahead of the 2023-2024 school year. Our objective was to deepen OCM's Chinatown presence by forming relationships with local elementary schools (i.e., staff, students, parents) and to build an active community of believers that cares for the Chinatown community.

During our event on August 19, we engaged over 200 families at OCM, many of whom live in the Chinatown neighborhood, through a children's worship program and arts & crafts, which were followed by the backpack giveaway. All of this was made possible with the help of an amazing team of volunteers across the English, Mandarin, and Cantonese congregations: 60+ volunteers assisted with day-of activities and 50+ volunteers helped fill the backpacks 2 weeks prior.

And I also have been writing articles for the Christian magazine which is distributed around Myanmar. I also have been writing a book under the topic of "Knowing heresy among Christians".

Ministry planning in the Fall and the upcoming year

I am doing a children's education ministry for the village's children who have no opportunity to go to school. Now I have four students (one girl is absent this year because she needs surgery on her backbone) and hopefully more children are coming next year. And I am planning to go to their villages to share the Gospel to their parents, their relatives, and the villagers as they all are Hindus.

Prayer requests for the ministry

By the mercy of God, I had laid the foundation to build a boy's hostel for the children's education ministry (The girl can stay with us) but I could not continue to finish the hostel for over a year since I have no financial resources. I want to complete this hostel within this year so that more students can come next year. Because there are still many children in the villages who have no opportunity to go to school. Now the situation in villages (around Pyin Oo Lwin where I live) is getting worse because of fighting between the military coup and PDF and the villagers are running from their villages. So, my prayer request for the ministry is to build a hostel completely in order to bring more children from the villages and they would get a shelter and the opportunity to go to school.

My personal prayer request: To serve the Lord more and more in the future through Children education ministry and through writing Chrisitan literatures, preaching, and sharing the Good News so that His kingdom will be extended.

Thailand Short Term Missions Trip



Kathy's Home (KH) is a dormitory in Pua, dedicated to the Hmong youth whose parents are rice farmers residing in the mountainous regions of northern Thailand. The Hmong people are an ethnic minority group (originally from China) who sought refuge and asylum from government persecution in Laos for supporting American-led anti-Communist campaigns during the Laotian Civil War. Missionaries Mak & Narola Sanglirs have been actively serving the Hmong communities in Thailand for over 2 decades. Their efforts have provided numerous Hmong children with a secure and nurturing home, and opportunities for formal education and spiritual guidance.

OCM has been partnering with the Sanglirs since 2008, and this year, OCM assembled another STM team of 9 members to Thailand. During our trip, we had the opportunity to connect with various missionaries, including our OCM sister Joanne Cheung Sanglir and her husband Steve, who are dedicated to ministering to the residents of a slum community in Bangkok. Additionally, we visited the Jordans, who are actively engaged in reaching out to the Prai people group residing in the mountainous regions. We also spent time at Beacon Hall, under the leadership of William and Karen Lenns, which provides support to KH alumni and other Hmong students pursuing higher education in Chiang Mai.

During our time at Kathy's Home, the team organized VBS lessons and interacted with the children through small group discussion and games. It was heartwarming to witness the kids confessed Jesus as their Savior, opening to us about their challenges, and experiencing spiritual growth. Toward the end of our trip, we had the privilege of meeting up with KH alumni in Chiang Mai and seeing what God is doing in their lives.
